The last weekend of March 1976 marked the tenth anniversary of M-ASA's operation at the Frederick Municipal Airport. Big changes have occurred during these ten years, and the following events may give some of the newer members a flavor of how things used to be. A fairly complete file of old Convectors and a pile of six log books provided most of the material.

- 3/66 Entire club fleet, a 1-26 and a 2/22 (ser. #2) towed to FDK from Westminster at the invitation of the airport manager. It was to be a single weekend operation. We liked it so much we never left. Large hanger (now Cessna shop) housed all equipment. First flights discovered excellent conditions.
- 10/66 Steve Silverman and Gene Wilburn make first high altitude wave flights at FDK going to 16,200 feet. Wilburn makes Gold gain on his barograph and completes first M-ASA Gold Badge.
- 4/67 John Hearn lands his HP-10 in a defoliation test field in Fort Dietrich.
- 6/67 Mid-Atlantic Regional Meet held at FDK for first time.
- 10/67 Dave Haber sets Maryland altitude record with 18,904 foot flight.
- 4/68 Dave Haber arrives with first fiberglass glider in M-ASA, a Libelle 301,
- 6/68 Ground broken for existing hanger.
- 10/68 Hangar occupied and not filled
- 4/69 Venerable 2-22 sold and replaced with new 2-33. An era ends.
- 5/69 Dave Haber completes first 300 km. flight from FDK, a 195 mile out and return to Elkton, Va.
- 7/69 Blanik goes 177 miles for Maryland multiplace distance record.
- 4/70 Cal Walker makes first 300 km. triangle in Md. and establishes a record at 30-9 mph.
- 10/71 ASK-13 purchased from Karl Striedieck and 1-26 sold.
- 12/71. Six Gold altitude gains in strong wave.
- 4/72 Val Brain completes 300 km. triangle in 4.5 hours. World record for free distance set in Germany, 894 mi.
- 6/72 First Smirnoff Derby finishes at FDK.
- 10/?2 Jonathan Gere climbs to 21,000 ft. in club KA-8, setting eight state records and earning Maryland's first and only Diamond altitude gain (at age 15).
- 4/?3 Lew Tuttle's SF-27M (for Motor) finally arrives.

7/74 28 Badge legs earned, including MDs first 500km. triangles completed by Walker, Hearn, and Hart.

2/75 First new towplane purchased, a Super Cub (01P)
